





TOTAL SELECTIONS RECEIVED	95,406


The NFWI Board of Trustees has agreed to put forward one Resolution to The Annual Meeting in June, Dental Health Matters. The wording is as follows:

"There is a chronic shortage of NHS Dentists and people are suffering health issues as a result. The NFWI calls on the Government to increase investment in the training and retention of dentists and to review the current inadequate NHS contracts in order to ensure everyone can access an NHS dentist wherever they live."

Every 3 days a woman is killed by her spouse or partner in the UK. Women's Aid this year is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year campaigning on violence against women.

Next year 2025 is the 50th anniversary of the Women's Institute's first campaign on the subject, demanding a refuge in every county if not in every town for women escaping such violence in the home. It's horrible that we still have to protest about this and felt really poignant that Mother's Day this year fell the next day.

CONVERSATION CAFES - UPDATE ON PROGRESS

You will remember that a group of us are exploring how we can best set up a 'conversation cafe' for refugees and asylum seekers, as described in WI News early last year and on myWI. The good news is that we are hoping to have a weekly 'cafe', based somewhere in Waltham Forest and with all interested WI members invited to participate, sometime in the second half of this year.

It's taken us a while to work out how we'll be able to organise these, get the venue, invite participants, run them safely, etc etc, but we're now making steady progress by partnering with Waltham Forest's 'Conversation Clubs' initiative. Sue Reid, Ann Smart and Ruth Kaufman are halfway through Waltham Forest's training course to enable us to set up such a club; Sanjeeda Ahmed is way ahead of us, having started the training before the rest of us had even thought of doing it.

END OF LIFE AND PALLIATIVE CARE IN WHIPPS CROSS HOSPITAL AREA

Tuesday 19 March at 6pm Waltham Forest council meeting discuss report

The report has finally been published. Ann B and myself have spent the last nine months attending a workshop at Whipps with other residents, clinicians and management getting the data together. The result is that the provision of such care services in Waltham Forest is seen to be really poor and Redbridge, although better, could be much better too.

With the new hospital still not materialising the Margaret Centre is 'safe' for the time being (so our efforts are all worthwhile). However, the Margaret Centre is seen as an acute ward whose beds are released in late afternoon to ease bed shortages in the rest of the hospital. It is not a hospice - and we don't have one in Waltham Forest, nor a hospice at home service that works. GPs at present aren't referring patients directly to the MC, so people arrive in A&E instead. The Centre isn't safe in the long term.

The main report recommendations are that there should be better communications between patient, their carers and health professionals, and better support for patients and carers in the community. To facilitate this, they propose setting up a single point of access to make accessing services simpler, improving access to medication within the community 24/7 and improving care services in the community. All well and good but there's no money. So the intention is to apply for a grant from a body called Social Finance (in conjunction with the Macmillan charity) that has to be paid back after 12 months if the proposed services are put into place. There are no costings yet and the report is quite vague in parts so we need to point that out.

Ann's helping me with a three-minute speech to the council and it would be great if some of you could turn up at support us and Action4Whipps at the Waltham Forest Council Offices - please be there by 5.45pm on Tuesday 19th March. Parking I think is still OK as people will have left work by then. Thanks for your support!


