- Developing the site as an incubator for creative enterprise

- Providing new pathways into work for local people
- Creating a regeneration vehicle for conservation, environmental and cultural benefit


#### **CHARITY NOMINATIONS FOR 2024**

#### WHIPPS CROSS, MARGARET CENTRE PETITION HANDOVER

In the December newsletter I mentioned that the Whipps Cross report on End of Life and palliative care was going to be presented to the Joint Health Scrutiny Committee (JHOSC) in January. This concerns not only Waltham Forest but Redbridge and Epping too. However, the report wasn't ready and won't now be presented with any proposed recommendations until the end of March.

Ann B and I have read the report data which we can't report in detail yet. However, apart from some really good practices, it confirms just how impoverished end of life services in the community are in our catchment area and the importance of a Margaret Centre/hospice. We expect budget restrictions will massively influence any proposals. Will keep you updated as we get news.

On Whipps Cross in general, there's no news about wider funding for the redevelopment of hospital so plans are on hold other than for the car park!

#### MILLION WOMEN RISE MARCH - SATURDAY 9 MARCH

For the past few years Ruth and I have joined the protest march against male violence towards women and girls organised by the Million Women Rise group. It's predominantly about the violence meted out to black women but such violence affects all women whatever their colour or ethnicity.

However, I've just gone on the MyWi website and this is the latest WI announcement:

The National Federation of the WI is **no longer be organising a WI presence at the Million Women Rise** march on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

We have taken this difficult decision due to a lack of information about the focus and messaging of this year's march. We contacted the organisers regarding these issues, but have unfortunately not received a response. We therefore feel that we have insufficient information to ensure that the event will be in line with our campaign and charitable objectives.

This decision was not made lightly, and we understand the disappointment it may cause. We sincerely apologise for any inconvenience this cancellation may cause and appreciate your understanding.

We will still be proceeding with an event focusing on our No More Violence campaign on that day at the existing pre-meeting venue in London. From 10am - 4pm we will be hosting a full day of activities offering members the opportunity to learn more about the issue and ways to campaign to bring an end to violence against women
