Wanstead WI CHARITY 2022 Report -

What truly generous, thoughtful ladies you are!

Maggie has provided an update from the Magpie Project.

Once again there was a tremendous response for gifts for the women who access The Magpie Project in Forest Gate and it was much appreciated.

We had been told that their party and gift giving would take place the week after our December meeting so we're given plenty of time to organise and collect. Instead, at the last minute, 95 asylum seeking families were sent to hotels in Newham and Magpie were inundated with pleas for assistance. To accommodate all the extra families Jane reorganised, planning two parties instead of one and bringing both forward by a week. Luckily two bags of presents had already been collected in November. Teresa and Maggie were also able to make up 35 more by using toiletries and toiletry bags you have donated along the way. 54 presents were delivered for the first party on the Thursday and another 51 were dropped off immediately after our December meeting for the party the next morning. I could admit that the snow almost derailed delivery too but they all reached Jane without incident.

I'm sorry some of you were unable to donate the gifts you had prepared. Snow prevented some from getting to our December meeting and as the parties had been brought forward there was no time to arrange an extra delivery. I believe some ended up at a food bank collection point instead so I'm sure they brightened the Christmas for someone.

Many thanks to Maggie and all those ladies who generously donate their time and efforts to giving comfort to those so less fortunate than most of us.

Local Foodbanks were our 2022 Charity

You will be pleased to hear that at year end we had raised a total of £1929.50, which is an excellent amount. At our meetings throughout the year members chose to distribute, on a quarterly basis, the monies raised so as to provide much needed funds to these organisations on a regular basis.

At your request, cheques were issued as follows: Jan to Mar - £327.00 to Eat or Heat Walthamstow, Apr to Jun - £294.00 to Ilford Foodbank, Jul to Sep - £357.00 to Ilford Foodbank, Oct to Dec £951.50 split equally to each of the above (£475.75 each). Your generous donations were very gratefully received by these foodbanks. Thank you to everyone who donated, organised events, made, crafted, and purchased homemade items and who in other ways helped to raise these funds.

This year our money was raised in the following ways: Home Produced / Craft Table - £1351.00 Cadogan Hall Ticket Donations - £490 Donations from activities and events - £88.50

In April we were also able to give the <u>Magpie Project</u> a cheque for £1761.40 (2019 to 2021 fundraising) and continued to support them with donations of warm blankets and knitting for babies and Christmas gifts for parents.

<u>AND</u> our monthly food collection for <u>Eat or Heat</u> continued throughout the year. <u>Charity Nomination 2023</u>

Each year we ask members to nominate and vote for a local charity they wish to raise funds for, through either our evening meetings i.e. Food bank donations, Home Produced Table or by specific events.

You may have a local Charity you wish to nominate. Please email our WWI email address with your suggestion as soon as possible so that we can start the selection process at the <u>March</u> members meeting.

We will continue to support the Eat or Heat foodbank and the Magpie Project as in 2022.

You may also have some ideas for fundraising in 2023. Perhaps we can restart our popular summer afternoon tea events in members gardens and our annual Quiz Night? Ideas and volunteers always welcome, please come forward with suggestions.
