#### UPDATE ON THE END-OF-LIFE CARE RESOLUTION

Frances has shared the following disappointing update on the resolution we submitted on end-of-life care. We did make it to the Essex level but not to the final five. Frances will give a verbal update at this month's meeting, but below is the email she received from national:

"Thank you for submitting a resolution for the 2023/24 process. We are sorry to share that, although it was a very interesting and important topic, your resolution did not make it to the shortlist this year.On behalf of the NFWI, I would like to thank you and all the members that were involved in developing your resolution. You have played an important role in the democratic process at the heart of all WI campaigns.

"We received many resolutions of a high standard this year covering a vast array of topics, with members putting a lot of research into their submissions. At the resolutions selection meeting representatives voted for resolutions they felt best met the selection criteria.

"The Public Affairs Department has put together guidance for WIs or federations that may want to strengthen their resolution or promote it on a local level, providing it falls within the WI's charitable objects. This guide is available here:

"Please also get in touch if you would like feedback from the meeting regarding your resolution, or advice on what to do next if you wish to keep working on the resolution.

"I would also like to highlight to you our training course on the resolutions process which is available on the WI Training platform. The course is open to all WI members including those who wish to submit a resolution or who are interested to learn more about WI campaigns. The course covers the NFWI resolutions process, the role of federations and Resolution Coordinators and the features of a strong resolution submission. You can access the course using your MyWI login.

"The shortlisted resolutions will be published next week and circulated via federations. We hope this does not discourage you from submitting a resolution next year, and thank you again for your time and research in submitting your resolution.
